AMENDMENT TO
PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT

PROJECT: Interfaith Community Services Social Worker Services for the City of Oceanside under the Homeless Services Manager 24-D0139-1

THIS AMENDMENT TO PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT (hereinafter "Amendment"), dated July, 1st, 2026 for identification purposes, is made and entered into by and between the CITY OF OCEANSIDE, a municipal corporation, hereinafter designated as "CITY", and INTERFAITH COMMUNITY SERVICES, hereinafter designated as "CONSULTANT."

RECITALS

WHEREAS, City and Consultant are the parties to that certain Professional Services Agreement dated April 24, 2024, hereinafter referred to as the "Agreement", wherein Consultant agreed to provide certain services to the City as set forth therein;

WHEREAS, the City and Consultant desire to continue the Interfaith Community Services and make certain updates to the program operations and related provisions; and

WHEREAS, the parties desire to amend the Agreement to provide for changes and/or modifications to the Scope of work and related program requirements, and compensation, as more fully set forth in this Amendment.

AMENDMENT

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereto do mutually agree that the Agreement shall be amended as follows:

1. SCOPE OF WORK. The project change is more particularly described as follows: The Consultant shall provide two (2) social workers to support the City of Oceanside under the direction of the Homeless Services Manager. The social workers will provide referrals, conduct limited outreach, facilitate access to social services, and offer short-term support to individuals experiencing homelessness. Services will be focused on assisting individuals in transitioning into temporary, transitional, and permanent housing opportunities, in coordination with the City's Homeless Evaluation, Assistance, and Response Team (HEART), under the leadership of the Homeless Services Manager.

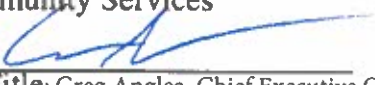
A more detailed Scope of Work is set forth in *Attachment A*, which is incorporated herein by this reference.

2. COMPENSATION. CONSULTANT'S compensation for all work performed per this agreement shall not exceed the total of **260,000 annually** for two years ending **June 30, 2028**, subject to the termination provisions of **Section 12** of the original contract attached.

3. SIGNATURES. The individuals executing this Amendment represent and warrant that they have the right, power, legal capacity and authority to enter into and to execute this Amendment on behalf of the respective legal entities of the CONSULTANT and the CITY.

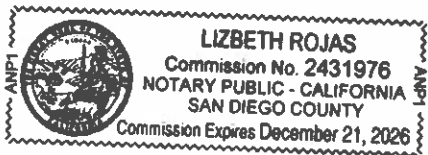

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Scope of Work: The Sub-contractor will provide two Social Workers to support the HEART (Homeless Engagement and Assistance Response Team) Program, operating in collaboration with the Homeless Services Manager. The outreach team will collaborate directly with the Homeless Services Manager. Both social workers will provide outreach, referrals, access to social services, and temporary support to persons experiencing homelessness, with the goal of assisting individuals in transitioning to temporary, transitional, and permanent housing. A more detailed scope of work is set forth in Attachment A, which is incorporated herein by reference.

Pre-Licensed and Licensed Mental Health Professional - Oceanside/Homeless Outreach Specialists (HOS)

Classification: Exempt, Full-Time (40 hours per week)

Number of Positions: 2 FTE

Reports to: Interfaith Community Services Clinical Outreach Manager, in collaboration with the City of Oceanside Homeless Services Manager

Scope of Work 2026-2028

Sub-contractor will provide two full-time Pre-Licensed or Licensed Mental Health Professionals to support the HEART Program within the City of Oceanside. These positions will operate under Interfaith Community Services and report to Interfaith Clinical Outreach Manager, who works in collaboration with the City of Oceanside's Homeless Services Manager.

The Pre-Licensed or Licensed Mental Health Professionals, also referred to herein as the Homeless Outreach Specialist (HOS), provides field-based outreach, short-term crisis intervention, and intensive care coordination to individuals experiencing homelessness within the City of Oceanside. The HOS will collaborate with City staff, community partners, PATH case managers, and multidisciplinary service providers to identify and connect individuals experiencing homelessness to resources that support stabilization, including medical, mental health, substance use treatment, income support, shelter, and housing services.

The HOS will provide street-based engagement, referrals, access to social services, and temporary support to assist individuals in moving into temporary, transitional, and permanent housing. Interfaith Community Services states that its work includes housing and support programs intended to help people move from crisis toward long-term stability.

The HOS will attend and support case conferencing and ensure that clients with ongoing treatment or service needs are connected with appropriate community-based treatment and support programs. The HOS will interact closely and support engagement with a multidisciplinary team that may include outreach workers, behavioral health clinicians, medical providers, substance use counselors, PATH case managers, housing partners, and other community providers supporting the individual's progress toward stabilization through housing.

Duties and Responsibilities

- Be knowledgeable about temporary, transitional, and permanent housing programs, including local shelters, residential treatment programs, housing vouchers, Navigation Center referrals, and applicable Interfaith Community Services programs and resources. Interfaith publicly lists emergency shelter, short-term housing, permanent housing, bridge housing in Oceanside, and recuperative care among its housing and shelter services.
- Treat all clients, visitors, and employees with caring, kindness, respect, and dignity.

- Assist unsheltered clients in obtaining and linking to shelter programs and housing resources, including emergency shelters, transitional or bridge housing, motel vouchers, reunification resources, and permanent housing opportunities.
- Assist clients in accessing county benefits and community resources to remove barriers to housing and long-term stabilization. This may include interacting with other agencies to support linkage and client engagement through advocacy.
- Provide resources to support the client's ability to obtain needed documentation for progress toward housing stabilization, including identification documents, birth certificates, Social Security cards, benefit verification, and other records needed for housing or services access.
- Serve as a liaison to coordinate care with the Oceanside Housing Authority, the Navigation Center, Interfaith housing programs, PATH case managers, and other agencies to best support client transitions from different living situations into permanent housing.
- Coordinate, as applicable, with the two PATH case managers stationed at the downtown Civic Center Library twice per week from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m., for so long as those positions remain contracted, to strengthen street-based case management, referrals to the Navigation Center, and connections to programs that best meet client needs. The City's library website lists the Civic Center Library at 330 N Coast Hwy and shows hours that cover this service period.
- Maintain contact and support care coordination with appropriate multidisciplinary teams to ensure due diligence for each individual's ability to link to appropriate resources and housing programs.
- Support the individual's ability to connect to and maintain linkage with resources, address barriers, and support the individual's housing plan by providing or arranging alternative transportation when appropriate.
- Report critical incidents and/or violations of Housing Voucher Programs to the appropriate City representative overseeing homeless or housing programs, consistent with applicable City protocols and contract requirements.
- Enter client data into HMIS and Interfaith Community Services data systems for data collection, care coordination, and reporting requirements.
- Attend all required weekly, monthly, and/or quarterly department, partner, and grant meetings as required by the City and Interfaith Community Services.
- Adhere to all safety and health protocols defined and outlined by Interfaith Community Services, the City of Oceanside, and applicable department procedures.
