Dear Mayor Sanchez, Oceanside Council Members and City Staff,

Some decisions are routine. Others define a city's direction for decades. The prioritization of coastal resilience is the latter.

Oceanside's beaches are not simply another CIP category — they are the economic and cultural foundation that makes every other investment possible. The City's commissioned report, *The Case for Coastal Resilience Investment: Quantifying Oceanside Beach as an Economic Asset*, confirms that our beaches drive approximately \$2.5 billion in annual visitor spending and support roughly \$68 million each year in Transient Occupancy Tax and sales tax revenue. Most projects require ongoing funding. Restoring the beach sustains it.

The report further models that a 10% decline in visitation equates to roughly \$250 million in annual economic loss, while more than \$16 million annually in property tax revenue and significant public assets remain directly exposed under a "No Build" path. Delay does not eliminate cost; it compounds it. Yet this is about more than revenue.

The beach is where Oceanside gathers — across generations, neighborhoods, and backgrounds. It is where families spend time together, where surf culture thrives, where community events unfold, and where visitors first understand what makes this City distinct. The shoreline is our shared front yard — inclusive, accessible, and central to our identity.

We have already lost approximately 140 feet of beach width since 1985. The longer stabilization and sand retention are deferred, the narrower the options become.

Therefore, we call on you, our elected officials, to:

1. Prioritize beach restoration: Make beach restoration the priority CIP project for the 2026–2027 fiscal year.
2. Commit to Long-Term Funding: Establish a protected funding framework and strategy to ensure we fund continuing coastal projects and coastal management.
3. Lead the Charge: Aggressively pursue all available federal and regional partnerships to secure funding for our coastal projects.

Capital budgeting and funding reflects values. When we protect the asset that underwrites our finances and defines our community, we protect Oceanside itself. That is not a project choice — it's a commitment of stewardship.

SOS stands ready to continue our work together to make beach restoration a reality for our community!
